What personal data we collect

- We will collect your name for the purpose of pseudonymized record keeping. This means you will be allocated a code which will be held separately from all project data. Your name (and any other identifying information) will be removed from all project data, unless you have requested otherwise.
- We may record participant gender to understand the demographics in the development consultancy and contractor sector.
- Further details are in the Participant Information Sheet.

Why we collect your personal data

We collect personal data under the terms of the University's Royal Charter in our capacity as a teaching and research body to advance education and learning. Specific purposes for data collection on this occasion are to understand the growing role of private sector consultants and contractors within the UK's foreign aid and development sector.

Legal basis for processing your personal data under UK GDPR

The legal basis for processing your personal data on this occasion is Article 6(1a) consent of the data subject.

How long we keep your data

As a condition of our research funding, some research data must be shared and stored in the UK Data Archive indefinitely. All identifying references will be redacted from any interview notes that are deposited in this repository, and all interview records will be pseudonymised and your name will not be used.

The researchers who gathered or processed the data may also store the data indefinitely and reuse it in future research. Measures to safeguard your stored data include pseudonymisation of all records and anonymisation of data as set out in the personal information sheet.
