

Table of bank partners in locations with active chambers 1767-1826.

The following table gives lists of the banking partners in each location for the first 20 chambers of commerce at the time of chamber establishment and immediate following years (plus the Bristol Society of Merchant Venturers – MV for 1774-90); the dates following each name refer to known period of active partnership in each bank. This table provides the source information for:

R. J. Bennett (2012) Network interlocks: the connected emergence of chambers of commerce and provincial banks in the British Isles, 1767-1826, *Business History*, vol. 54.

Note 1: London bank partners referred to in the *Business History* article are not listed as they are too numerous: see full listings in the sources cited in that article; however, the members of the London chamber of 1823-4 with their banking links are listed on this website under ‘the members of the early chambers’.

Note 2: the listing is for all banks that have been discovered, but entries must be treated as approximate, and not all partners may be active or alive at the exact dates shown; some precise dates of bank foundation and closure are uncertain. Note 3: the other business interests of the banking partners have been listed where these have been found, but it is known that this is incomplete; fuller information where they are chamber members is given on this website under ‘the members of the early chambers’. Similarly not all London agents of each bank have been traced, and the full list of governors etc. of the chartered banks is not listed.
